## Citation of Chinese names

In order to bring the Kew Bulletin into line with Notes from the Royal Botanic Garden, Edinburgh, and with official policy of the People's Republic of China, citations of the names of Chinese Provinces and Autonomous Regions should be given using the Pinyin System of Romanization of Chinese names, instead of the systems (basically Wade-Giles) hitherto employed.

The Pinyin forms of names are to be found in the Chinese Atlas, "Zhonghua Renmin Gongheguo Fen Sheng Dituji" (1977), at T4.4 in the Travels' Room, and (for mainland China) are also used in "The Times Atlas of the World Comprehensive Edition" (ed. 6, 1980); "The Times Atlas of China" (1974) uses the Wade-Giles system, but gives Pinyin equivalents in the Index for every name used.

In order to expedite the use of the Pinyin forms by staff, the following tables are provided.

Table I gives the hitherto used spellings of the names of the Provinces and Autonomous Regions and their Pinyin equivalents. Tables 2, 3 and 4, giving some other equivalents, are added for the convenience of staff in tracing localities on modern maps; they are, however, far from exhaustive.
