A Note on Orthography

Until 1972 the orthography of Bahasa Indonesia and Bahasa Kebangsaan, Malaysia (the two national languages) reflected the orthography of Dutch and English respectively. In 1972 the orthography was changed and standardized as a major step towards the unification of the two languages. Most modern atlases now follow the new orthography.

The main changes are as follows:?-

The changes in orthography have been followed almost consistently in Indonesian except for personal names. In Malaysia, however, the changes have not been applied to place names (apparently for legal reasons).

e.g. Kuching (a cat) is now Kucing but Kuching (capital of Sarawak) remains Kuching

Besides the main changes, there have been changes in spelling to Malay words with second syllables containing "o": such words are now uniform with Indonesian.

e.g. gunong (Malay - a mountain) is now gunung (old Indonesian orthography goenoeng) telok (Malay - a bay) is now teluk

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tanjong (Malay - a cape, also Mimusops) is now tanjung lubok (Malay - a deep pool is now lubuk
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Irritating though changes to familiar botanical localities may be, the new orthography should be followed. If in doubt consult 'The Times Atlas'' Comprehensive Edition, 6 Edition (1980).
